Pre-Separation Counseling

Sep 4 & 18, 8 am - 12 pm

The mandatory Pre-Separation Counseling process represents the most holistic, personal, and extended component of TAP. Service members begin the final TAP process between 12 and 24 months but no later than 90 days prior to separation. Members receive in-depth counseling from trained and qualified TAP professionals allowing them to plan and prepare effectively for all aspects of transition.

EFMP Specialized Training of Military Parents (STOMP)

When a child receives special education service under the Individual with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), he/she must have an Individualized Education Program (IEP) which is a written education plan. The IEP is an important document in the educational lives of students with disabilities receiving special education under IDEA. If your child doesn't qualify for an IEP, he/she may still be able to get help through a 504 plan to ensure the school provides the proper support. Learn your rights as a parent of a child with a disability.
